Mark Your Calendars For March And April

A lot of emails have come my way asking about dates for the Spring Council meeting in Washington, D.C., and my short answer is: probably sometime in late April, but we're still working on a venue.

That's because our multi-year contract with the Alexandria hotel property across the street from the King Street Metro is finished, and that's a good opening for us to look for ways to respond to some of the concerns many members have shared with us about everything from the location to the costs to participate.

Bottom line is that there will be a Spring Council Business Meeting, and if you're looking to block out dates, I'd block out the last week of April to attend because that's when Congress will return to Washington. However, I would not -- just yet -- make nonrefundable bookings, either for travel or places to stay.

But as all of you reading this know, we have a new House, a new Senate, and a new Administration coming to town next month. Our advocacy will take on new urgency, and our strategy for telling the story of passenger rail and how it can bring prosperity to every corner of our country is going to have to adjust.

That's why we've decided to dramatically expand the idea of Day on the Hill, hosting two weeks' worth of workshops for our members, donors, and supporters at our DC offices and conducting four separate rounds of visits with congressional delegations over that two-week span.

Kansas Delivers Update on Heartland Flyer Extension

The Kansas Department of Transportation reported that it will cost a minimum of \$311 million to extend Amtrak's *Heartland Flyer* service from Oklahoma City, OK to Newton, KS.

Currently, the train operates between Fort Worth, TX, and Oklahoma City, with five intermediate stops. In a public call held Wednesday, KDOT outlined a plan to extend the service north to Wichita with a new terminus in Newton, where passengers would be able to connect to the *Southwest Chief*.

"The full reconnection of this corridor, which was discontinued in 1979, will provide increased transportation choices and economic opportunity for rural and urban residents and businesses," said Martin Alvarez, KDOT's rail project coordinator.

Thessaloniki, Greece, Opens New Metro System With Stations Adorned With Archaeological Finds

Thessaloniki, Greece, opened a new 9.6 mile, 13 station subway system on November 30, 2024. The city of 319,000 people, with a metropolitan area of just over one million people is the second-largest city in Greece, after Athens, and was one of the largest cities in Europe without a mass transit system.

The system, which is fully automated and driverless, cost an estimated 3 billion euros, or \$3.24 billion, including \$649 million in future interest payments. The system was highly anticipated and is expected to service 256,000 passengers daily while removing close to 60,000 cars from the congested roads of Thessaloniki per day. This transit system is estimated to reduce the area's CO2 emissions by 212 tons per day.

The system is expected to expand to five new stations by 2025, but it will likely not be until 2040 when the line reaches the city's Macedonia Airport.

First proposed in the 1910s, ground only broke on the transit system in 2006. While initially scheduled to open in 2012, the Greek financial crisis of the 2010s postponed its opening. Construction of the subway system also led to the continued excavation of historic archaeological artifacts. "Archaeologically, it has been an extremely complex and difficult endeavour," said the culture minister, Lina Mendoni, of the more than 300,000 finds made since construction began. "To get here required a battle on many fronts."


The excavation to construct the system yielded the discovery of over 3,000 archaeological artifacts from the ancient Greek, Roman, and Byzantine empires. This led to a requirement that the tunnels be constructed at a minimum of 20 meters below surface level. Construction was halted on several occasions while historians and archaeologists recovered new finds. After touring the Venizelou station, Greek prime minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, said: "I think that when the people of Thessaloniki have the chance, tomorrow, to see this station they will recognise the huge effort that has been put in so that the city could have antiquities and a metro." This new transit system will help rehabilitate the image that the central government has neglected the nation's northern region.

Among the artifacts recovered are two marble squares, an early Christian basilica, a Roman-era thoroughfare, water and drainage systems, and ancient Greek burial sites replete with jewellery and gold.

Representative artifacts are featured among the 13 stations on the new metro station, and more will be represented when new stations are added next year.

Staff Updates


Your staff is at the table, in the field, having the conversations that make a difference for passengers across the country. Learn what they're up to each week and how you can support your Association's key missions!
